

IRISH SELF-DETERMINATION
AGENDA, Wednesday, Jan. 15, 1919.

1. Reconsideration of subjects discussed at meeting of Committee on Jan. 8.
2. Discussion of movement similar to one proposed here, begun by Judge Meldrum, of Savannah, Ga., working through the old Friendly Sons of St. Patrick and such like societies. Also of movement, opposed to "Self-Determination", and led by John Quinn, Esq., of New York. This latter is apparently fully organized; its promoters are taking steps to win support of prominent men.
3. Reconsideration of names of persons to be invited. Their number: 15, 25, 50, 100, 250, etc.?
Form of invitation. Stating that movement is not for Home Rule, not for Independence, but in support of the Principle "that the people of Ireland be permitted to determine for themselves through a free and fair plebiscite the form of government under which they wish to live" (From the Catholic University to President Wilson)
Suggestion that invitation be issued (1) in name of Rt. Rev. Rector alone, or (2) with addition of 3, 4 or 5 names, of Cardinal Gibbons, Cardinal O'Connell, John D. Ryan, Senator Phelan, Senator B.- Hugh Doheny.
Should representatives of Irish societies be invited, e.g. Friends of Irish Freedom, Ancient Order of Hibernians, Clan-na-Gael, American Irish Historical Society, United Irish League, Ladies (?)
4. Date of proposed meeting. Lincoln's Birthday (?)
5. Appointment of local Committee to arrange for details, such as stenographer, stationery, press, in re meeting.
6. Discussion of Programme of meeting.
